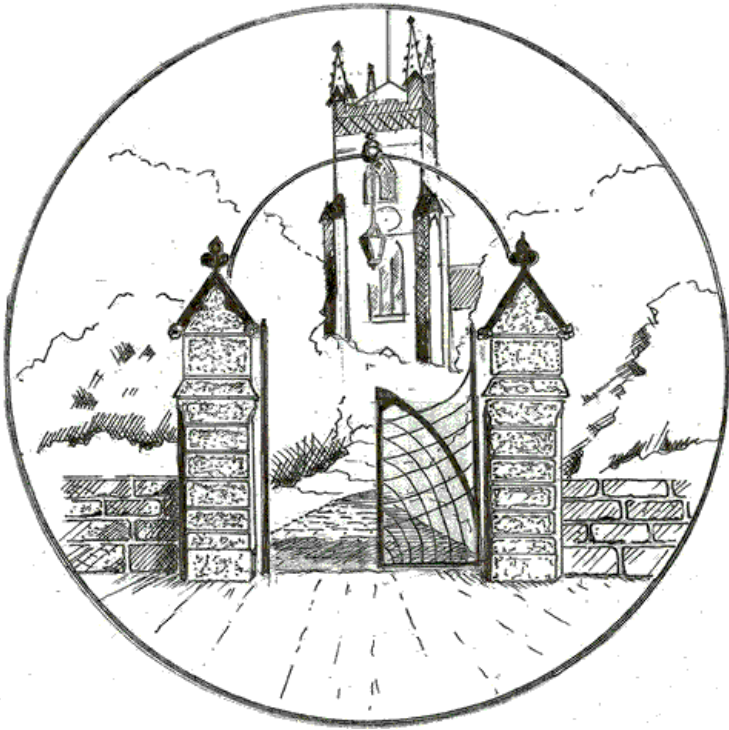

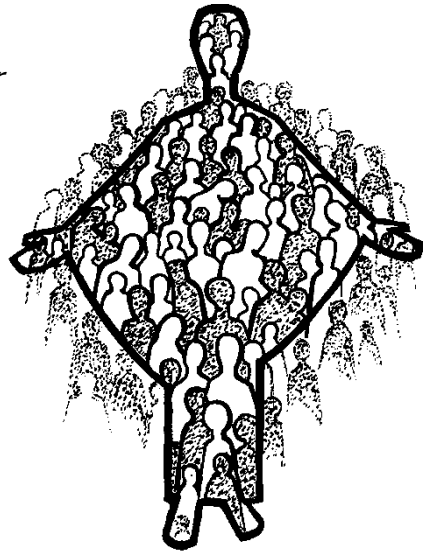

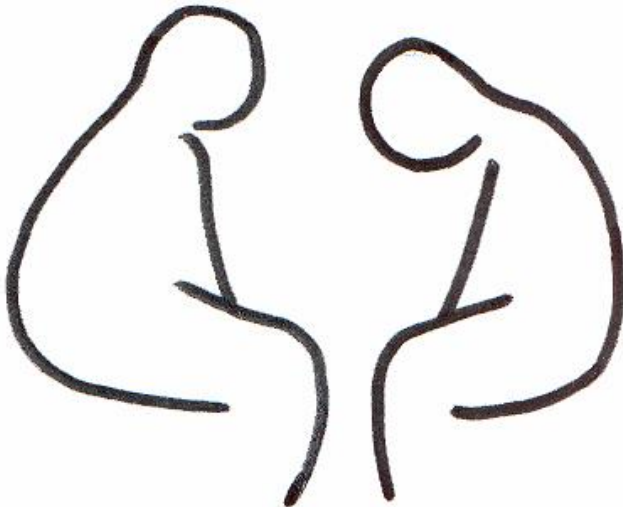

It is right to give thanks and praise.

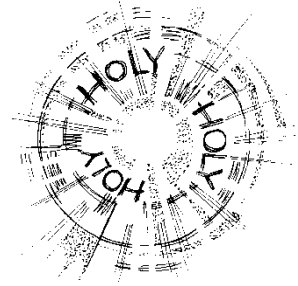
It is indeed right,

Through him you have freed us from the slavery of sin,
giving him to be born of a woman and to die upon the cross;
you raised him from the dead

and with all the company of heaven,
we proclaim your great and glorious name,
for ever praising you and singing:

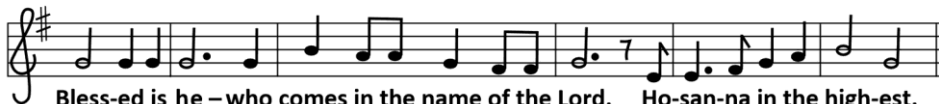




Ho-ly, Ho-ly, Ho-ly Lord, God of power and might;

we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.



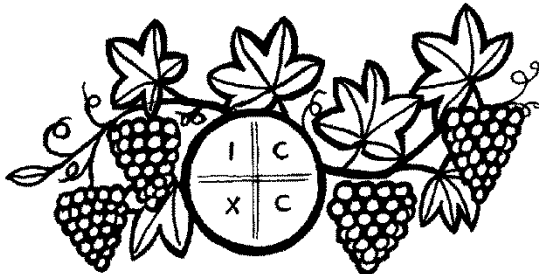

The Lord is here.

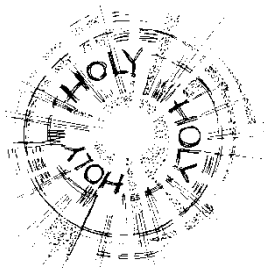

Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh; as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, he lived on earth and went about among us; he opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us; and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:



Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness;
grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit,
and according to your holy will,
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;
who, in the same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;

until you come in glory.**

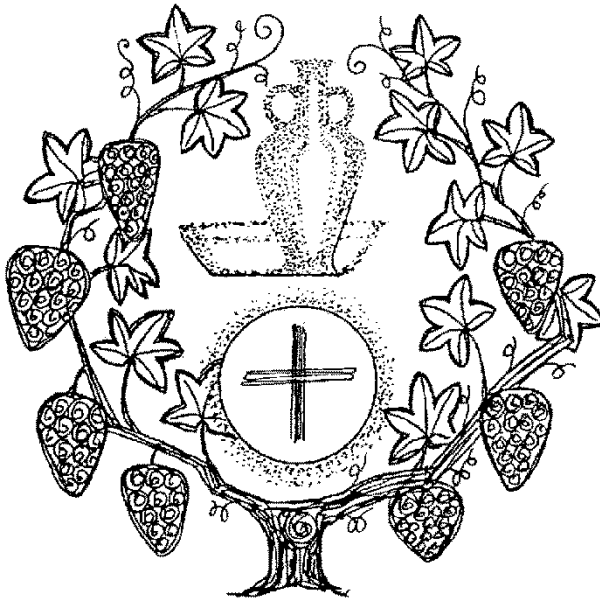
So, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross,

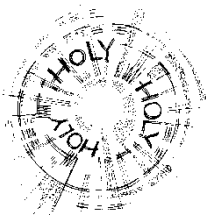

You are the Saviour of the world.**

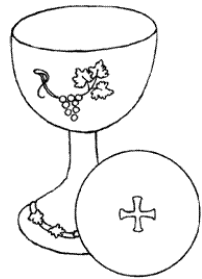
Lord of all life,

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

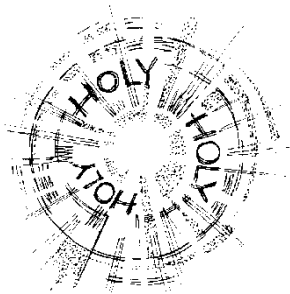
It is right to give thanks and praise.

do this in remembrance of me.

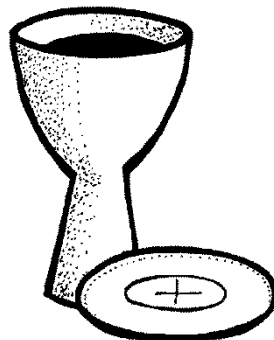
At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine,

Amen.**

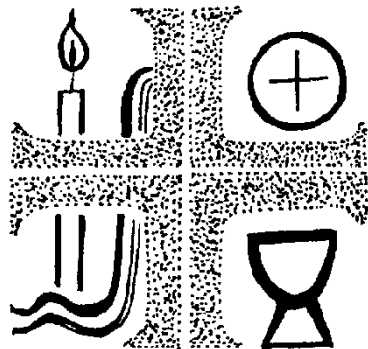
Breaking of the Bread

in one bread.**



Giving of Communion

Authorised words of distribution are used and the communicant replies
Amen.*

*We invite all those who receive communion in their own churches to
come forward for communion.*

*If you do not wish to receive communion please feel free to come
forward for a blessing. You may indicate this by keeping your
hands at your side.*

*Because the chalices are deep, please help the chalice assistant by
guiding the chalice when receiving the wine.*

The choir may sing an anthem after the distribution of communion.

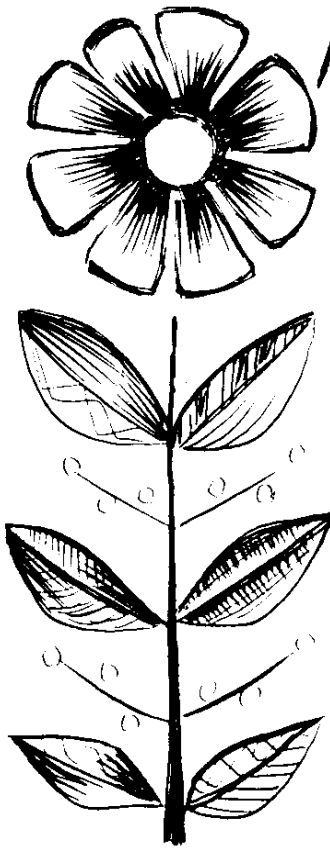
